- 2. WWOZ's 27th Annual Piano Night Benefit. Program Director Dwayne Breashears reported that the 2013 WWOZ Piano Night Benefit, held on April 29, 2013, was acclaimed by attendees and critics alike, and production of the event went smoothly. Strategic Development Director Lauren Del Rio was able to secure four corporate sponsors for Piano Night, three of whom were new to the event. As always, WWOZ Piano Night featured world-renowned pianists performing simultaneously on three stages at the House of Blues from 7:00pm until midnight. This year, the WWOZ Piano Night soloists were: Keiko Komaki, Tom McDermott, Bob Malone, Marco Benevento, Ike Stubblefield, Terrance Simien Trio featuring Danny Williams, Liz McComb, Paul Longstreth, Bob Andrews, Joe Krown, Marcia Ball, Carol Fran and Cindy Chen, Brian Coogan, and Joshua Paxton. The WWOZ Piano Night House Band featured Doug Belote, Eric Bolivar, Mark Brooks, Todd Duke, Herb Hardesty, and Renard Poche. Piano Night attendees were also treated to a special appearance by The Brass-A-Holics.
- 3. Membership. Membership reports that as of April 30, 2013, WWOZ general membership donations have raised \$405,063 from 4,828 members, compared to \$376,471 from 4,515 members at this time in 2012. Currently, approximately 55% of WWOZ members live outside of the state of Louisiana. WWOZ Brass Pass sales to date have generated a total of \$1,325,754 from 2,069 members, as compared to \$1,358,424 from 2,097 members in 2012. More than 63% of WWOZ Brass Pass holders live in Louisiana. Membership distributed more than 1,700 Brass Passes before the first day of the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival on April 26, 2013. Brass Passes were distributed over the course of three weeks, and at several locations, including Rouse's Supermarket in the CBD, Whole Foods Uptown, Whole Foods in Metairie, and at The Old U.S. Mint during the French Quarter Festival. Brass Passes were also available at the WWOZ studios during the week leading up to Jazz Fest, and at the Will Call ticket station at the New Orleans Fairgrounds during the festival itself.
- 4. Major Giving. Major Giving has received \$98,358.60 to date in FY2013, a year-to-date increase of \$17,527.50. WWOZ Strategic Development Director Lauren Del Rio successfully secured four corporate sponsors for WWOZ Piano Night 2013, three of whom were new to the event. WWOZ Board Treasurer Mary Johnston Norris hosted two evening cultivation events at her residence in conjunction with the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival, on Saturday, April 27, 2013 and Friday May 3, 2013. WWOZ supporters Courtney and Michael Katzenstein will host their second ticketed fundraising event for WWOZ at their residence in New York City on May 18, 2013, the day following the A Great Night in Harlem concert at the Apollo Theater on May 17, 2013. All WWOZ Board Members are invited to attend the New York event, and may purchase tickets through the web link Ms. Del Rio sent via email earlier this month.
- **5.** Underwriting. WWOZ received \$26,479.00 in additional underwriting revenue through April 22, 2013. WWOZ Underwriting Representatives Melanie Merz and Don Paul secured several new accounts, including San Francisco's Boom Boom Room and the Brass Camera Gallery.

- 6. Swamp Shop. The WWOZ Swamp Shop grossed \$12,500 in April 2013 a 59% increase over April 2012 – bringing its total revenue to date in FY2013 to \$124,334. More than \$5,000 of April's income was generated from sales of the WWOZ cookbook That Sounds Good! and other WWOZ merchandise at the Louisiana Music Factory and Kitchen Witch. The Swamp Shop earned an additional \$4,000 through sales at three events: The Creative Flea Market at the Contemporary Arts Center (April 21, 2013); Brass Pass Distribution at WWOZ (April 23-25, 2013); and WWOZ Piano Night 2013 (April 29, 2013). Swamp Shop Administrator Melanie Merz rolled out new WWOZ t-shirts, coolers and beverage coozies well ahead of the 2013 New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival to accompany the ever-popular rain ponchos and umbrellas. Swamp Shop sold approximately 30 copies of the WWOZ's cookbook That Sounds **Good!** from the Jazz Fest Book Tent at the Fairgrounds – a high number, according to our fellow booksellers. In addition, WWOZ held two live cooking demonstrations at Jazz Fest, featuring John Boutté on April 26, 2013 and Lena Prima on May 2, 2013. Swamp Shop is also set to begin talks with Louisiana Music Factory on Decatur Street as it aims to establish a ground-floor retail presence in the French Quarter.
- 7. Marketing & Development. Starwood Hotels and Resorts Worldwide has awarded WWOZ a \$5,000 contract to supply curated content in connection with a promotion being conducted by the Sheraton New Orleans at the end of May 2013.
- 8. Outreach. WWOZ hosted an outreach table at the French Quarter Festival from April 11-14, 2013, in conjunction with Brass Pass distribution. WWOZ's *Thursday Night Swingin*' performance series at The Prime Example continued with performances by Sharon Martin (April 11, 2013), Davell Crawford (April 18, 2013), Donald Harrison (April 25, 2013), and Stephanie Jordan (May 4, 2013). WWOZ's *Musically Speaking* Tuesday night film series at the Antenna Gallery continued with screenings of *The Five Heartbeats* (April 16, 2013), *Soul to Soul* (April 23, 2013), and *Chops* (April 30, 2013).
- 9. Bury the Hatchet Screening. WWOZ and The Theatres at Canal Place co-hosted a film screening fundraiser on May 1, 2013, with the generous support of WWOZ Board member Karen Solomon. Attendees viewed the award-winning documentary Bury the Hatchet, directed by Aaron Walker. The film features three Mardi Gras Indian Chiefs in a portrait of the unique and endangered culture of New Orleans they represent as bearers of tradition, as artists, and as musicians. Mr. Walker was in attendance, as were two of the chiefs featured in the film, Flaming Arrows Big Chief Alfred Doucette, and Fi-Yi-Yi Big Chief Victor Harris.
- 10. Big Easy Music Awards. The Foundation for Entertainment Development and Education honored the city's best music at its "Big Easy Awards" gala held on April 23, 2013 at Harrah's in New Orleans. Big Easy Award winners for 2012 included WWOZ show host Sondra Bibb ("Guardian of the Groove" Award On Air) and WWOZ volunteer Duane Williams ("Guardian of the Groove" Award On Air). WWOZ Board member and show host David Torkanowsky served as the event's Honorary Music Chairman.

- 11. National Federation of Community Broadcasters Conference. General Manager David Freedman, Volunteer Coordinator Maryse Déjean, and Underwriting Rep Melanie Merz will attend the 38th Annual NFCB Community Radio Conference from May 29 to June 1, 2013 in San Francisco. Mr. Freedman, a member of the NFCB Board of Directors, will participate as a co-host of the "Urban Station Summit." Ms. Dejean will participate as facilitator of a "Volunteer Coordinators' Solution Center" and as one of three speakers at the "Volunteers: Changing the Paradigm" workshop.
- 12. New Media. The New Media team authored and posted 44 blog entries on the wwoz.org homepage dedicated to the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival. Early web statistics show site visits increased by more than 30% during both weekends of Jazz Fest 2013, compared with 2012. The digital team also authored numerous and frequent Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest posts during the Jazz Fest period. The digital team created a Jazz Fest "Food of the Day" daily blog on the web site and the WWOZ Facebook page, featuring a description and photographs of a dish on offer at the festival. Dishes featured on the blog included the Cochon de Lait Po-Boy, Crawfish Monica, and - of course - WWOZ's own Mango Freeze sorbet. Several of the "Food of the Day" blog posts generated very large numbers, with 20,000-30,000 page views, more than 400 Facebook "likes" and more than 200 Facebook "shares." New Media Director David Stafford and Integrated Projects Manager Dave Ankers coordinated the WWOZ volunteer photographers for Jazz Fest and the WWOZ Piano Night. Ryan Hodgson-Rigsbee, Kichea S. Burt, Hunter King, and Bill Sasser created impressive folders of content for the web site and the WWOZ Flickr page, and their photographs will be of great use in marketing both events in 2014. David Stafford, along with consultants Ian Johnson and Ariana Hall, continued work on the user interface redesign of the WWOZ web site, discussing goals, directory structures, and navigation, as well as specific page layouts. Beyond serving as a productive music and technology outlet, participating in KLSP also provides a space for direct communication and expression through music and musical commentary."
